

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Kindergarten Orientation

Our last Kindergarten Orientation 2020 session is being held this Thursday Morning from 9:15. If you are a current Kindergarten parent, we invite you to come along and meet our new Kinder parents during this time and help make them feel welcome. Morning Tea is being provided. We look forward to seeing you here if you are able to come.

Attendance

1. **Holidays** – While not encouraged, occasionally students travel during term time. An application must be made to the school prior to the leave occurring. (This absence must not exceed 100 days in a school year).
2. If a student's absence is due to **sickness** the principal may request a medical certificate in addition to an explanation if the explanation provided is doubted or the student has a history of unsatisfactory attendance.
3. An explanation of the absence is provided which has been accepted by the principal. This may be due to:
 - misadventure or unforeseen event
 - participation in special events not related to the school
 - domestic necessity such as serious illness of an immediate family member
 - attendance at funerals
 - travel in Australia and overseas
 - recognised religious festivals or ceremonial occasions.

TIP:

***Be firm:** You are the parent and children need to feel secure in knowing that you always mean what you say. Don't say things if you can't or won't do it. Children have plenty of friends, but they only have one mum/dad. Being a parent is more important, more special and much harder than trying to be their friend.*

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Attendance cont.

Develop incentive programs: to encourage and reward the behaviour you want to see. Everyone likes to be rewarded for trying hard and doing their best. Children respond to small rewards, praise and little treats. Nothing big or expensive, maybe just some time with you kicking a ball, a bike ride or fish and chips! You could also use a chart and put a sticker up for each time the child gets ready for school on time – at the end of the week you could agree on a reward for their efforts. Being positive makes everyone happy.

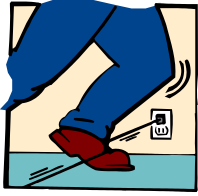
Your Child's Medical Needs

Emergency Procedure Practice

Last week the staff and students practised a Bush Fire Drill. All students and staff made their way to the Administration building where we talked about what it would be like to 'Shelter in Place' until we are evacuated in the event of a bushfire. The drill went well and students returned to the classes to resume learning without incident. Jilliby Public School is classified as **Bushfire Prone**. In the event of catastrophic conditions (as it was last Tuesday) the authorities will make a decision regarding school operation.

FOUR SIMPLE STEPS

There are four simple steps to get ready for a bush fire:



DISCUSS

STEP 1

DISCUSS WHAT TO DO IF A BUSH FIRE THREATENS YOUR HOME

Many households find that having a discussion over dinner works best as everybody is together and focussed.



PREPARE

STEP 2

PREPARE YOUR HOME AND GET IT READY FOR BUSH FIRE SEASON

There are simple things you can do around your home to prepare it for a bush fire, like keeping the grass low and having a cleared area around your home.



KNOW



STEP 3 KNOW THE BUSH FIRE ALERT LEVELS

If there is a fire in your area you will find its alert level on the NSW RFS website and in the 'Fires Near Me' app. You need to keep track of the alert level so you know what you should do.



KEEP

STEP 4 KEEP ALL THE BUSH FIRE INFORMATION NUMBERS, WEBSITES AND THE SMARTPHONE APP

In a bush fire, it's important that you stay up to date on conditions in your area. It's a fact. If you and your home are well prepared, you stand a better chance of surviving a bush fire. Download the four simple steps today.

FIRE DANGER RATING	WHAT YOU SHOULD DO
CATASTROPHIC	<p>For your survival, leaving early is the only option.</p> <p>Leave bush fire prone areas the night before or early in the day – do not just wait and see what happens.</p> <p>Make a decision about when you will leave, where you will go, how you will get there and when you will return.</p> <p>Homes are not designed to withstand fires in catastrophic conditions so you should leave early.</p>
EXTREME	<p>Leaving early is the safest option for your survival.</p> <p>If you are not prepared to the highest level, leave early in the day.</p> <p>Only consider staying if you are prepared to the highest level – such as your home is specially designed, constructed or modified, and situated to withstand a fire, you are well prepared and can actively defend it if a fire starts.</p>
SEVERE	<p>Leaving early is the safest option for your survival.</p> <p>Well prepared homes that are actively defended can provide safety – but only stay if you are physically and mentally prepared to defend in these conditions.</p> <p>If you're not prepared, leave early in the day.</p>
VERY HIGH	<p>Review your bush fire survival plan with your family. Keep yourself informed and monitor conditions. Be ready to act if necessary.</p>

Works notification

Dear parents/carers,

Upcoming planned maintenance at Jilliby Public School will require the removal of asbestos containing material. Testing conducted by an independent hygienist has confirmed that the material is bonded asbestos, which means it is attached to other material such as cement or vinyl and cannot be crumbled by light pressure.

This contaminated material will be removed in accordance with the Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan and Safe Work NSW regulations. This removal will be done by licensed and accredited asbestos removalists, with monitoring undertaken by occupational hygienists in strict accordance with all applicable legislation, regulations, policies and guidelines.

The material is scheduled to be removed on Saturday 23 November 2019. No asbestos containing material will be removed during school hours.

Testing will continue to be carried out to ensure the site has been fully remediated. We will keep you informed if further contaminated material is found which requires removal.

The health, safety, and well-being of the school and the local community is our highest priority. Please be assured that the removal of this material will not pose a risk to the local community.
