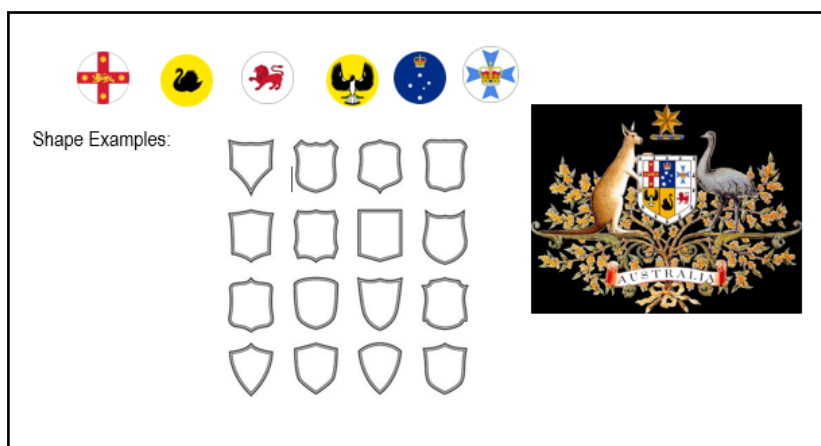
- Colouring - (K-2)

Colouring-in competition around the history of the valley and its tree-logging days. These will be distributed/available in the coming weeks.

- Design a shield - (3-6)

Create a Dooralong/Jilliby motto and shield for display. The shields should be no bigger than an A4 sheet. Students should consider the valley and its endeavours. Who are the people? What do they stand for? What do they do?

Why are their lives important? What animals frequent the valley? Are there plants which are unique to the valley? What important industries still exist? Why has the valley changed over the years? This could be part of a family discussion and joint investigation. They should also look at shields from our National states and territories for design ideas. The Australian Coat of Arms includes a shield to represent the 6 states.

Working Bee

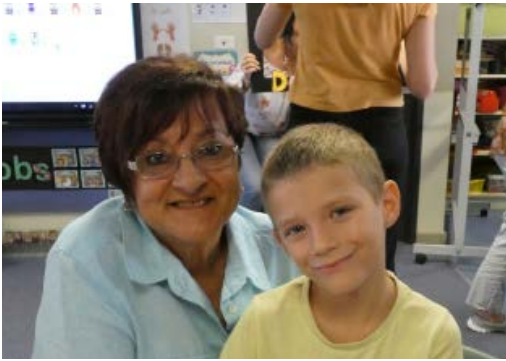

HARMONY DAY

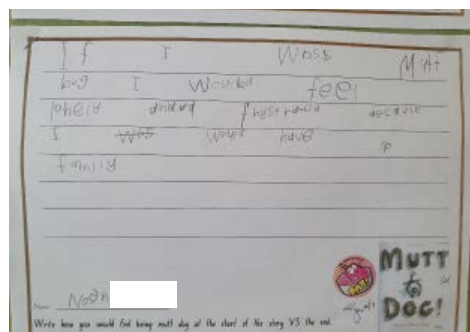
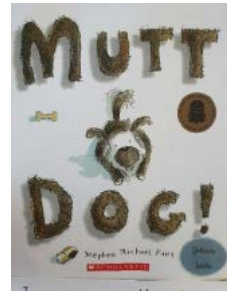
