Book Now: Parent/Teacher Interviews - 18th March 2020 3:30 - 6:30 pm

Parent/ teacher interviews are an opportunity to discuss your child's strengths and weaknesses. It also an opportunity to determine how your child can be assisted at home with their education and to touch base about the standard of work your child is achieving.

Why it's worth going to parent-teacher interviews

Parent-teacher interviews give you a great opportunity to:

- learn more about your child's academic, emotional and social development
- meet and get to know your child's teachers
- help your child's teachers understand more about your child
- make plans with the teacher about how you can both support your child
- build a relationship with your child's school.

If you don't have any particular concerns, you might wonder whether it's worth going to parent-teacher interviews. But going along is one way to **show your child that you're interested in their learning** and what's happening for them at school.

Some suggested questions you could ask are:

- 1. How has my child's education improved so far this year?
 - This is the 'where have they come from?' question. This question focuses on how much your child's learning has improved during the year and sets the scene for your child's next steps in learning.
- 2. Where should my child be now?
 - Where should my child's learning be for their year group and age, not just compared to other students in their

class, but compared to the expected national standards. Are they ahead, at the required level, or are they behind?

3. What does my child need to learn next?

The more accurately your child's teacher can answer the question of where your child sits with respect to other children around Australia, the more useful the answer to this question will be.

4. Is my child engaged in class and enjoying the subject?

Ask the teacher about your child's attitude towards learning in general and especially their effort level. The answer to these questions can help you understand if you need to play a part in improving your child's attitude to learning.

5. Is my child happy?

Ask about your child's socialisation skills. Do they make friends easily? Do they have a variety of friendship groups? Do they behave appropriately?

Please return interview selection notes to the office as soon as possible to ensure you are able to secure your preferred time slots.

Attendance

When your child is absent from school.

Thank you to everyone who is helping us maintain safe procedures for attendance. I am very happy with the increased number of parents who are ensuring their child is safe and contacting the school when they are absent. It is vital that information regarding why your child has not attended on a particular day is conveyed to the classroom teacher or the office within seven days of the first absence. For example: if a child is away on Monday Tuesday and Wednesday, the parent needs to advise the school by the following Monday the reason for that absence by the ensuing Monday or the child is marked absent without explanation. This cannot be changed later even we are notified.

****Please note if your child arrives late without explanation you will receive an SMS to remind you to contact the school and give the explanation. You can then call or email to let us know****

TIP:

Develop good routines: Children NEED routine. These habits are a good foundation that will help kids throughout their school life and into the future;

Get uniforms, school bag and all school things organised the night before

Go to bed at the SAME, reasonable time each night

Get up at the SAME time each morning

Have breakfast at the SAME time each morning

Leave for school at the SAME time each day (be on time!)
